Re: Material Safety Data Sheet Statement

Dear Valued Sav-A-Life Customer,

The Occupational Safety & Health Administration (OSHA) requires hazard communication for toxic and hazardous substances. OSHA regulation 29 CFR Part 1910.1200(a)(1) states the purpose of the hazard communication standard:

The purpose of this section is to ensure that the hazards of all chemicals produced or imported are evaluated, and that information concerning their hazards is transmitted to employers and employees. This transmittal of information is to be accomplished by means of comprehensive hazard communication programs, which are to include container labeling and other forms of warning, material safety data sheets and employee training.

Sav-A-Life communicates the hazard of our drug products through the instruction manual included with your kit. This instruction manual contains all of the necessary information to safely use and store our products. MSDS are only required for hazardous drugs. OSHA Technical Manual Section VI: Chapter 2, Controlling Occupational Exposure to Hazardous Drugs, provides a list of common drugs considered hazardous. None of the drugs distributed by Sav-A-Life are on this list and to the best of our knowledge none of the drugs have any characteristics which would categorize them as hazardous.
